About the Sheep Sustainability Framework

The [Sheep Sustainability Framework](#) was launched in 2021. The role of the Sheep Sustainability Framework (SSF) is to monitor, measure, and report on the performance of the Australian sheep and wool industry against sustainability priorities.

Data and trends gathered through the SSF help to identify opportunities on-farm, in transport, processing, and at the customer interface where practices can be improved by both the industry and individuals.

In doing so, the SSF can be used by industry to help protect and grow access to investment, finance, customers, and markets by providing credible evidence of performance and improvement. Further, individual enterprises may use the Framework to understand the industry's material issues and consider these in their forward planning.

The Sheep Sustainability Framework is owned, designed, and developed by the Australian sheepmeat and wool industry through the peak national policy and advocacy bodies Sheep Producers Australia (SPA) and WoolProducers Australia (WPA).

The SSF is led by an independent Sustainability Steering Group (SSG). The sheep industry Research and Development Corporations (RDCs), Australian Wool Innovation (AWI) and Meat & Livestock Australia (MLA) provide resources in support of the SSF.

About the position

The role of an SSG Member is to support the Australian sheep and wool industry in demonstrating its commitment to sustainability through the reporting and activities of the Sheep Sustainability Framework. Furthermore, SSG members are expected to represent and promote the Framework in the sectors of the value chain in which they are actively involved.



More specifically, the SSG is responsible for the design, development and delivery of the Framework, monitoring progress against the SSF's [Strategic Plan](#) and providing feedback on relevant issues related to sustainability reporting and stakeholder engagement. The Steering Group also takes primary responsibility for examination and reporting on the Framework's material topics.

To complement the current skills and composition of the SSG, Expressions of Interest are sought for people with **experience and knowledge of wool processing and retail**.

Benefits in getting involved

Members of the SSG have the opportunity to support the sustainability of the Australian sheep industry by improving reporting on the care of our animals, land, people and communities.

Additionally, you will be part of a forward-thinking and collaborative committee that strives for continuous improvement and to be on the forefront of industry sustainability reporting. There is also opportunity to engage with a wide variety of stakeholders throughout the Australian sheep value chain that actively participate in and align with the Sheep Sustainability Framework.

Key skills and qualifications

The successful candidate will have:

- Strong understanding of the Australian wool supply chain, particularly wool processing and retail, including the challenges and opportunities in meeting consumer demands for sustainable product.
- Strong knowledge of issues affecting the sustainability of wool businesses operating within Australia.
- Strong interpersonal and communication skills.
- Ability to analyse complex issues and work with others to collaboratively arrive at sound decisions.
- Willingness and availability to attend committee meetings and key events.

Desired (but not essential) qualities may include:

- Understanding of Australian sheep production.
- Knowledge of best practices and standards in sustainability reporting.
